


ORDINANCE NO. 293

AN ORDINANCE MAKING APPROPRIATIONS: PROVIDING MONIES FOR THE ANNUAL PERIOD BEGINNING OCTOBER 1, 1994 AND ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 1995. TO PAY THE ITEMS IN GENERAL OPERATING FUND, SEWER SALARIES, OTHER EXPENSES, CAPITAL OUTLAY EXPENDITURES AND IMPROVEMENTS, AND FOR OTHER SPECIFIED PURPOSES OF THE VARIOUS DEPARTMENTS OR THE CITY OF BONIFAY, A MUNICIPAL CORPORATION UNDER THE PROVISION OF CHAPTER 73-129 ACTS OF THE 1973 LEGISLATURE KNOWN AS THE "MUNICIPAL HOME RULE POWERS ACT: AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE:"

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE PROCEDURE
FOR OBTAINING PERMIT FOR THE RODEO PARADE
ESTABLISHING PROCEDURE TO BE FOLLOWED DURING
AND BEFORE THE PARADE AND ESTABLISHING THE
THE PERMIT FEE WHICH MUST BE PAID BY THE
APPLICANT SEEKING THE PERMIT

The City Council of the City of Bonifay, State of Florida
does ordain as follows:

SECTION ONE

The City of Bonifay may grant the privilege to any
applicant to hold a Rodeo parade, when the granting of such
privilege will not impair the city's ability to provide adequate
protection and security for the residents hereof.

SECTION TWO

Before the City may issue any permit hereunder, the person
or organization seeking such permit shall file an application
setting for the following:

- (a) The name, address, and telephone number of the person
filing the application.
- (b) The exact time, duration and date of the parade.
- (c) The estimated number of participants in the parade.
- (d) A map showing the location of the parade, location of
designated officials.

SECTION THREE

The City may charge a permit to be based upon the number of
participants and horses in the parade. The initial permit charge
shall be:

SECTION FOUR

The applicant shall meet with the City the Council meeting
preceeding the rodeo to discuss the application.

SECTION FIVE

This ordinance shall take affect and be in force from and
after the passage according to law.

RULES:

1. No horse(s) or other animals shall be allowed on any city sidewalk.
2. No horse(s) shall be allowed on the following streets: Oklahoma.
3. Only one rider per horse (No double riding).
4. The Mayor and Chief of Police shall approve the order of placement of all entities in the parade.
5. The parade shall not commence until approved by the Chief of Police.
6. All horses shall be under control at all times. Any horse not under control shall be removed from the parade.
7. The Chief of Police shall submit a parade route to the Council.
8. Each block shall have one police officer or designated auxiliary officer.
9. All politicians or other celebrities shall have their security personnel to coordinate with the Chief of Police. All politicians shall give the City as much notice as possible so security can be verified.
10. Liability insurance shall be obtained by the applicant in the sum of _____.
