

ORDINANCE NUMBER 93

AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE NO. 56 BEING AN ORDINANCE TO PROHIBIT SECULAR BUSINESS ON THE SABATH DAY IN THE TOWN OF BONIFAY:

Be it enacted by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Bonifay that Ordinance No. 56 be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to open his, her or its place of business for the transaction of any secular business on Sunday within the City limits of the City of Bonifay for the purpose of buying, selling, receiving or delivering goods, wares or merchandise, or performing the business of barbering. Provided that meat markets and others may sell fresh meats, ice, bread, cigars, tobaccos, and cold drinks during the hours from 7:30 am to 9:30 am and 4:00 pm to 6:00 pm, provided further that filling station shall be permitted to remain open at their option for the sale of gasoline, oils, and automobiles accessories.

Section 2. Any person or persons violating the provisions of this ordinance shall be punished by fine not exceeding five dollars or imprisonment not exceeding ten days in the City Jail, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 3. This ordinance shall become a law immediately upon its passage and approval.

Section 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.


