

ORDINANCE NUMBER 101

AN ORDINANCE TO DEFINE ALCOHOLIC OR INTOXICATING LIQUORS, AND BEVERAGES, WHETHER SPIRITOUS, VINOUS, OR MALT, OR FRUIT JUICES, WITHIN THE MEANING OF THE ORDINANCES OF THIS CITY. BUT NOT TO ALTER EXISTING ORDINANCES REGULATING THE SALE OF WINE FOR SACRAMENTAL PURPOSES.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL, AND MAYOR OF THE CITY OF BONIFAY, FLORIDA.

Section 1. All liquors and beverages whether spiritous, vinous or malt or fruit juices, containing more than 3.2 percentem of alcohol by weight shall be deemed and held to be alcoholic or intoxicating liquors or beverages, within the meaning of any and all ordinances of this City prohibiting, regulating or relating to the manufacture, or sale, or barter or exchange, or transportation, or possession, or custody, (or control) of alcoholic or intoxicating liquors or beverages, but this ordinance is not intended to refer to Ordinances regulating the sale of alcohol for medical scientific or mechanical purposes, and wine for sacramental purposes.

Section 2. All Ordinances and parts of Ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval by the Mayor, or its becoming a law without such approval.
